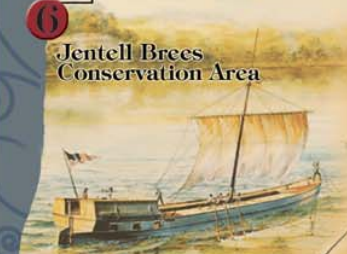
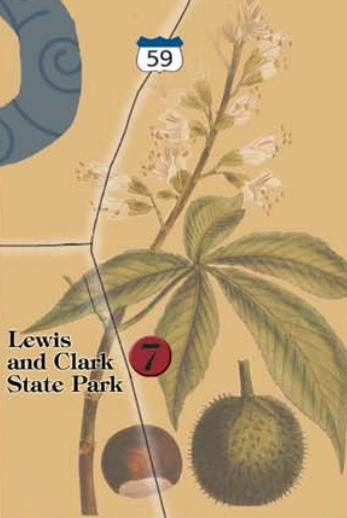

- 1. "we proceeded on" - Sunbridge Hills Conservation Area**
Exit I-229 at Highland Avenue
East 1 block to Huntton Road
North on Huntton Road 2 miles to Sunbridge Hills Conservation Area
- 2. Provisions and "Spiritous Heqnor" - Sunset Grill/River Towne Resort**
Exit I-229 at Highland Avenue
West on Highland Avenue 1 block to McArthur Drive
Northwest on McArthur Drive 1 block to Waterworks Road
North on Waterworks Road 1.4 miles to Ellinger Road
West on Ellinger Road to Sunset Grill on River Road

- 3. Keelboat - French Bottoms River Access**
Exit I-229 at Highland Avenue
West on Highland Avenue 1 block to McArthur Drive
Northwest on McArthur Drive 1 block to French Bottoms Public Fishing Access
- 4. The Men of the Corps of Discovery - Wyeth Park**
Exit I-229 at Central Business District (Felix Street if traveling south; Edmond Street if traveling north)
North on 3rd Street to Francis Street
West on Francis Street to Main Street
North on Main Street to Poulin Street
West on Poulin Street to Elwood Street
North on Elwood Street to Wyeth Park
- 5. St. Michael's Prairie - Riverfront Park**
Exit I-229 at Central Business District (Felix Street if traveling south; Edmond Street if traveling north)
North on 3rd Street to Francis Street
West on Francis Street to Riverfront Park
- 6. Jentell Brees - Jentell Brees Conservation Area**
Exit I-229 to Mo. 759 South (Stockyards Expressway)
South on Mo. 759 3 miles to County U (Alabama Street)
West and south on County U 5.5 miles to Contrary Creek Rd
West on Contrary Creek Road 1.2 miles to Gentle Brees Conservation Area
- 7. 4th of July 1804 - Lewis & Clark State Park**
Exit I-229 to Mo. 759 South (Stockyards Expressway)
South on Mo. 759 to exit U.S. 59.
Take U.S. 59 south from St. Joseph.
Continue south on Mo. 138. West(right) in to Lewis and Clark State Park.

St. Joseph Missouri

- 8. St. Joseph Museum - 11th and Charles Street**
First location in the city to receive National Park Service designation as a certified site on the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail, exhibits tell about the Lewis and Clark experience as they passed St. Michael's Prairie (today's St. Joseph). Exhibits include a panoramic view of the prairie and Missouri River. A large sculpture of Lewis, Clark, Sacagawea, York, and Seaman is also featured.

- 9. Glore Psychiatric Museum - 3106 Frederick Avenue**
"Medical Aspects of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, 1804-06." Lewis knew there would be no doctors along to keep the men healthy on the expedition. He spent nearly three months in Philadelphia learning basic health care from Dr. Benj. Rush - one of the leading physicians and thinkers of that time. By combining journal entries, documents and period artifacts the exhibit illustrates many of the medical challenges the corps faced on its nearly three-year expedition. The museum received site certification designation by the National Park Service Lewis And Clark National Historic Trail in July, 2002

- 10. Riverfront Hike & Bike Trail -**
Accessible from 1st and Main Streets or from McArthur Drive and Waterworks Road
A 1-1/2 mile scenic trail with five Lewis and Clark interpretive signs throughout.
- 11. Chief White Cloud Memorial - South St Joseph**
3rd Street and Southwest Parkway, off Alabama St.
A life sized bronze statue of Chief White Cloud, memorializing his importance in the signing of the Platte Purchase. To be in place by Spring 2004.
- 12. Sacajawea Statue - St. Jo Frontier Casino -**
I-229 to Highland Avenue Exit
Life size statue of the Native American who served as a guide for the Corps of Discovery. Interpretive signage at the site tells her remarkable story.
- 13. Riverfront Heritage Camp -**
Accessible from Riverfront Hike & Bike Trail and from McArthur Drive and Waterworks Road.
A cultural heritage camp featuring a Native American Earth Lodge, Lewis and Clark winter stockade, and authentic early 1800's log cabin. Interpretive signage throughout.
- 14. Squaw Creek National Wildlife Refuge - Mound City, Missouri**
Lewis and Clark interpretive signage tells the story of the Little Tarkio River.
